PROFESSIONAL OPTIONS (9 credits)

Any elective course in architecture. At least 6 of these credits must be at 300 level or higher.

GENERAL ELECTIVES (20 credits)

Any courses, with the following limitations:

At least six credits of electives must be at the 300 or higher level.

No more than nine credits of non-required architecture courses may be used to fulfill elective requirements.

No more than two credits of exercise and sport science or athletics can be used toward a degree.

No more than four credits of ROTC can be used toward a degree.

The following courses that are below the threshold performance requirements of Math 142, English 104, and Physics 111;

Math 100, 140, and 141, English 101, Physics 101 and 106.

Courses that duplicate in part required architecture courses: Construction Engineering 241.

NOTES:

1. Six credits of Humanities and/or Social Sciences must be taken during the preprofessional program.

2. Up to nine credits of general electives offered by other departments may be taken pass/not pass.

3. Architecture courses taken in fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Architecture must be taken for a grade, including those taken to fulfill general elective requirements.

ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

English Proficiency

A minimum grade of C- is required in English 104 and 105. Transfer students who have not completed the equivalent of 104 and 105 will have composition requirements determined by the English department.

International Perspectives (3 credits)

The international perspective requirement will be certified upon completion of either Architecture 221 or 222.

U.S. Diversity (3 credits)

The U.S. Diversity requirement will be certified upon completion of 3 credits from the following list. This course can also be used to satisfy other curriculum requirements, such as humanities, professional options, general electives, etc.
