Student Achievement	
<p>Students that secure internship and want to get credit can register for CRP 530: Practicum. These courses may be taken for 1 to 3 semester credit hours and is repeatable. At the end of the internship, the student's supervisor is expected to complete and submit an evaluation form to the CRP Department internship coordinator. Supervisors evaluate the interns on a number of indicators on the student's performance including their writing ability, speaking ability, understanding of planning concepts, ability to analyze problems, and effectiveness in carrying out assignments. For each of these indicators, the intern is rated on a scale of 4 (Excellent = 4; Good = 3; Fair = 2; Poor =1). We use the overall mean score for these indicators as a measure of overall student achievement in the program. Note that some of the students who complete planning internships, decide not to register for the course credit so their supervisors are not required to complete an evaluation form.</p>
